Festival Etiquette

Please help us optimise the performance experience for our participants!

Following a few simple rules will help us make the Festival experience a positive one for both the audience and participants:

1. Please do not enter the auditorium during a performance or when the Adjudicator is speaking.
2. While in the performance auditorium, please make every effort to be as quiet as possible:
 - a) Please refrain from rattling papers or books.
 - b) If you must speak to your neighbour, please do so in a whisper, but not during a performance or adjudication.
 - c) Sometimes small children and babies create a disturbance; we understand this but would ask that you accompany them out of the auditorium to reduce the impact on those around you and the participants. Please do not bring food or drink (other than water bottles) into the auditorium.
3. Please do not leave the auditorium during a performance or when the adjudicator is speaking UNLESS:
 - a) you, or the person you are accompanying, are ill.
 - b) you are accompanying a small child or baby who is creating a disturbance.
4. Please do NOT use your FLASH when taking a photograph.
5. Please ensure your cell phone - and anything else that beeps - is turned off or silenced.
6. Make every effort to comply with the requests from Festival staff.

Competitor's Notes

Participants are encouraged to attend the entire session in which they perform and are responsible to be on time.

1. Notify the secretary's desk **before** the competition if you are unable to perform.
2. Leave a copy of your music at the music table before your competition. Collect your music after your performance.
3. Your adjudication sheets and certificates will be ready shortly after your class adjudication. Please pick them up at the music table, if you have not received it from the adjudicator.
4. Please do not approach the adjudicator's table.
5. Competitors must provide one original score or authorized copy of music for the Adjudicator. A photocopy may be used by the performer or accompanist.
6. **To qualify for an award:**
 - a. **Participants must enter in a minimum of 2 entries in Solo classes in the same discipline.**
 - b. **Participants must be from the northwest quadrant of Alberta.**
 - c. **Memorization is required to receive any awards at the local or provincial level.**
7. **All award recipients are chosen by the adjudicators.**
8. **No entrants may practise in the festival halls.**
9. All performances will be assessed according to RED, GOLD, and SILVER standards, and NO marks will be announced or written on certificates. The appropriate seal for the standard will be placed on every certificate, and only the first placement may be announced. Adjudicators will be asked to maintain a record of marks for their personal use as a tool to help them with decision making for awards, scholarships, and provincial recommendations.

The Grand Concert participants are suggested by the adjudicators and the Festival Committee. The concert is programmed to provide variety and audience appeal and to recognize excellence.

The recipient is expected to use monetary awards to further their musical education.

To be the recipient of an award, a student must have a minimum of two memorized entries in solo classes in the same discipline and reside in the northwest quadrant of Alberta.

Perennial trophies are the property of the North Peace Performing Arts Festival Association. Recipients are responsible for returning trophies in sound condition before the following year's festival begins.

The adjudicator and the Festival committee reserve the right to not grant an award should an appropriate candidate not be found.


